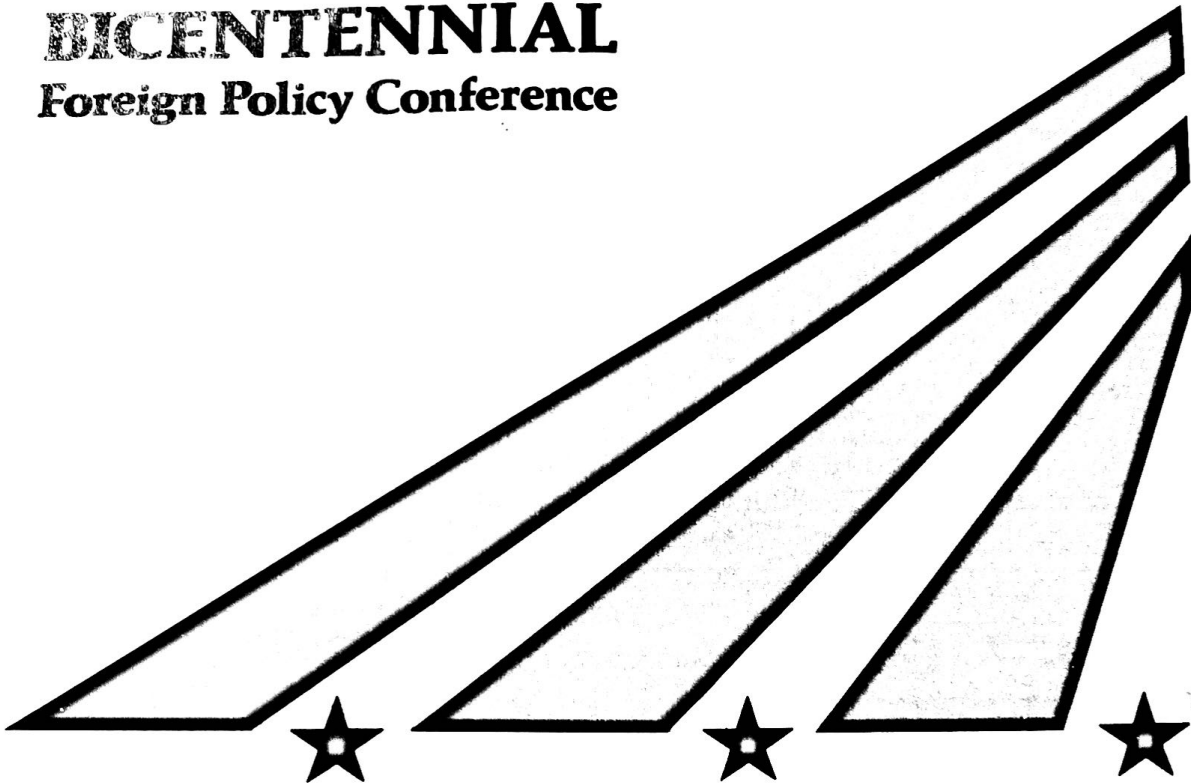

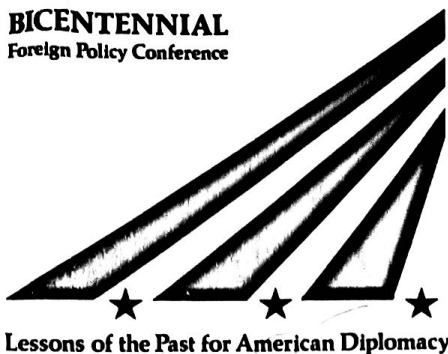

Conference Location:

By automobile: Leave Interstate 71 at 17th Avenue, then drive west on 17th and 15th Avenues to High St. Go north on High St., past the campus, to Lane Avenue. The Holiday Inn is two blocks west.
